WE ROLL TOGETHER



Sinkumunchis is una a combination of 3 roots / morphemes from the Quechua language.

1. Sinku(y): Roll
2. Mu: In a remote place
3. Nchis: All of us

*Note: Sinku, without the y means sphere or ball. It can be used to refer a game of football.



Isolation and discrimination of a certain sector of the population are some of the biggest problems in Peru, our country.

WHAT DO WE DO?

Through an intercultural sports program, we support Quechua farmer communities that, living in extremely precarious situations, are forgotten by the state. We help them acquire both technical and soft skills with the objective of orienting them towards a more promising future.

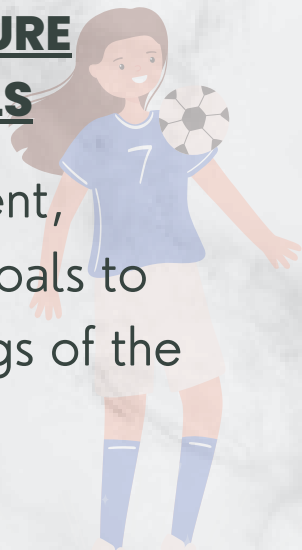

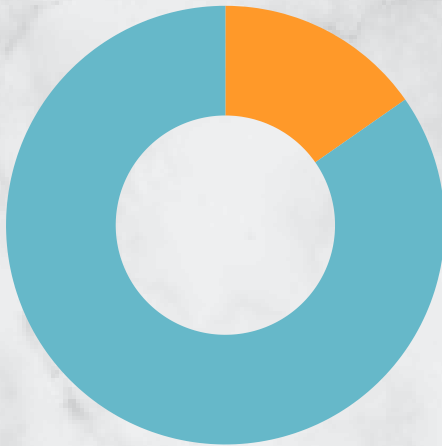

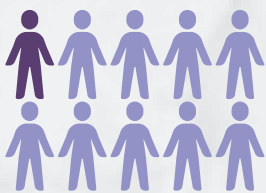

THE PROBLEM - SPORTS IN PERU

If you're far from Lima, you have much lower access to high quality sports and physical education programs



80% of male football players

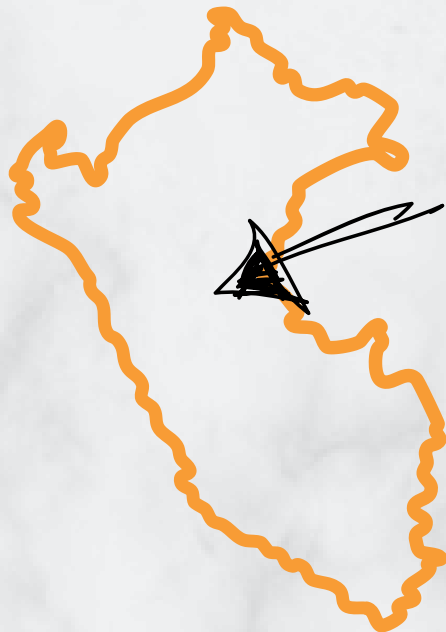
in the Peru national team are from the Lima/Callao area. There is not a single one from the Anean region

30% of the women's national football team players

are foreigners. More than half of the team is from the Lima/Callao area.

PLAYERS ABROAD

In spite of being the 4th most populous country in South America, we are the second to last (9th) South American country, according to FIFA, in the number of players that play abroad in more competitive leagues

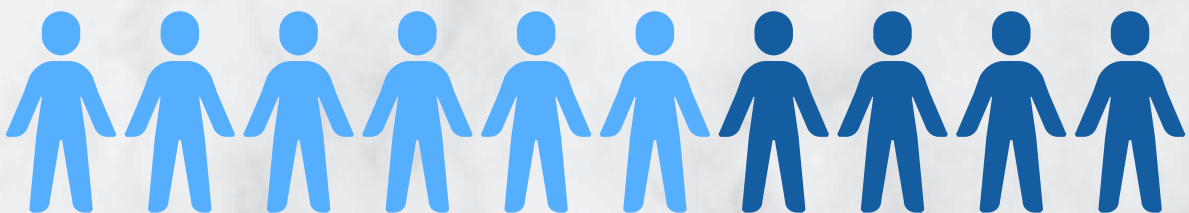


We are based in the Inca Sacred Valley of Cusco and Andahuaylas and our work impacts more than 15 Quechua-speaking communities in the Peruvian Andes

According to Fulbright "there is great amount of evidence from international studies (...) that suggest a positive relationship between participating in sports (...) and academic and emotional wellness."

Fulbright also mentions that "when it was asked 'How do you feel when you're playing football?'. the most popular response was that participants felt happy."

Since we launched in 2021 we've opened four Sinku schools.

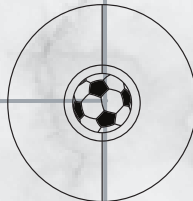

Approximately 1000 students benefit weekly from our intercultural sports programs



ORGANIZING INTER-DISTRICT TOURNAMENTS

We've organized countless inter-district tournaments in which our students display what they have learned on the pitch in a competitive environment

We help bring our students from their communities to other communities in order to play in the tournaments

The tournaments allows them to see new places and make new friends

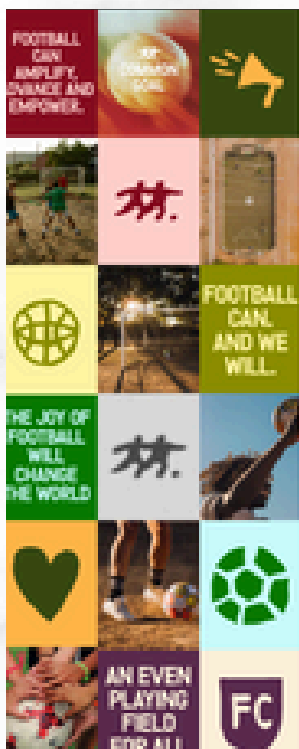
