

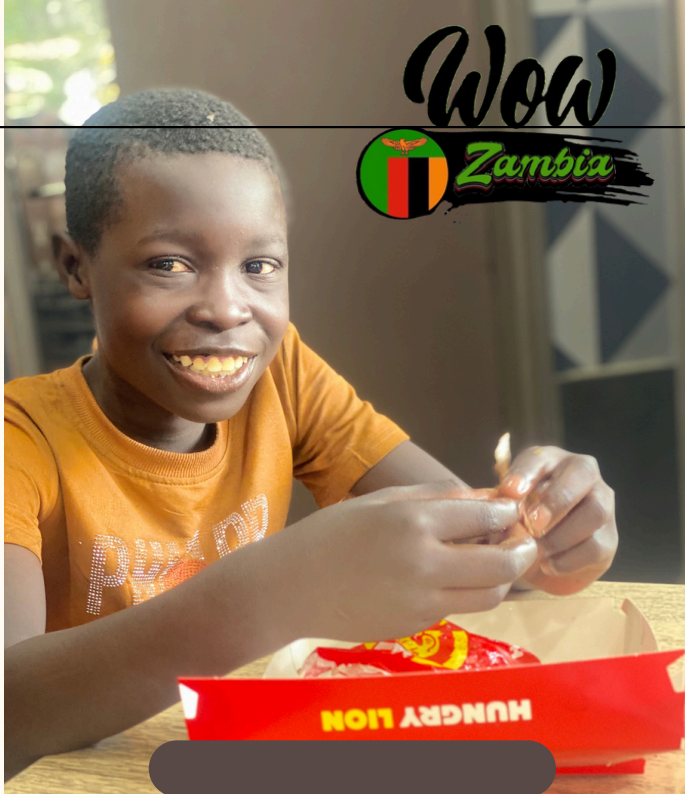

An update on your Children

From the Streets of Zambia: A Child's Cry for Hope

In Zambia, estimates vary — some sources suggest there are around 75,000 street children in major cities, though the true number is believed to be much higher given the challenges of tracking this population.

but he looked us in the eye and asked, "Can you put me in school?" Struck by his desire for learning, we responded that we would do everything possible to help.

We bought him a meal — nothing elaborate, just enough food — so he could return home without needing to beg that day. Then we gave him our contact information, hoping his brother will find a way to reach out.

His story is just one of thousands across Zambia, where many children struggle without food, shelter, or access to school. Economic hardship and broken safety nets have forced countless young ones to survive on the streets.

During our recent visit, we witnessed this reality in a deeply personal way. While eating at a Hungry Lion restaurant, we noticed a little boy, no older than eight, sitting just outside on the sidewalk—soiled clothes, and clearly malnourished. He lingered, begging for scraps. Then, summoning courage, he stepped into the restaurant, quietly pleading with diners for food.

This heartbreaking scene is all too familiar in both Zambia and Tanzania. It pressed on our hearts to do more, to reach more.

We learned that this boy lives with an unemployed older brother who is unable to care for him. He is not enrolled in school,

When There Are No Classrooms

Beyond the heartbreaking number of children living on the streets, we also discovered another silent crisis in Zambia—the lack of proper learning environments. In several villages outside the main towns, children gather under trees or sit on rough stones to attend class. There are no desks, no chairs, and often no roofs to protect them from the harsh sun or rain.

These children sit quietly on the ground, balancing their notebooks on their laps, listening carefully to teachers who do their best with almost nothing. When it rains, school stops. When the wind blows, papers scatter. Yet, despite it all, their determination shines. These children are eager to learn, to read, and to dream of a better future.

Education is the foundation of opportunity, but without classrooms and basic resources, many are left behind. That is why our mission goes beyond food and sponsorship—it extends to ensuring that every child learns in a safe, dignified, and supportive environment.

We are committed to working with local communities and partners to help build and equip classrooms where children can grow, thrive, and pursue their dreams. Thank you for standing with us, believing in our mission, and making it possible for us to bring hope and lasting change—one classroom at a time.

Back in Tanzania, we are approaching the end of the school year this November. The children will be on break in December and return to school in January 2026. As we shared last month, we are overjoyed to announce a major milestone—our first child has graduated from high school!

His name is Hussein, and his journey is one of perseverance and grace. When Hussein's father passed away, his family fell into instant poverty. They were nearly homeless, struggling to find food each day. Three years ago, we welcomed Hussein and his three siblings into the Sponsor-A-Child program. Since then, we have been blessed to walk beside them, providing school fees, tutoring, meals, housing, and emotional support.

Because of your generosity, Hussein was able to stay in school, attend boarding school this year, and now proudly graduate. We are still waiting for his test results, but we could not be prouder of how far he has come.

Hussein's sister Saumu, and Joseph, share similar stories. Without your support, they might have been on the streets fighting to survive—but today they are in school, learning, growing, and dreaming of a brighter future.

Each month, we visit the three children during family visitation day, bringing them essentials such as notebooks, shoes, socks, peanut butter, pocket money, sugar, and other supplies they need to succeed.
