Transforming Community Health in Kenya: The Pamoja kwa Afya Bora Initiative

UCESCO Africa's work is driven by a clear belief: **healthcare is a basic human right**. Every person deserves access to treatment, dignity, and hope; regardless of income, location, or circumstance. Our mission is to deliver free, high quality healthcare to underserved communities while strengthening them through health education and preventive care. Guided by our vision of a healthier and more equitable Kenya, we uphold core values of **inclusion, community service, and health equity** to ensure no one is left behind.

Our medical program was created in response to the urgent realities observed in the communities we serve. In informal settlements like Kibera and Mathare, and in drought-affected regions of northeastern Kenya, families experience severe barriers to healthcare. Diseases spread rapidly in overcrowded areas, chronic illnesses such as hypertension and diabetes continue to rise, and malnutrition remains widespread among children. Access to clean water and sanitation is extremely limited, leading to preventable deaths from diarrhea, pneumonia, and other infections. These challenges laid the foundation for our medical outreach approach.

A medical camp functions as a temporary mobile clinic that removes barriers to care by bringing **services** directly to the community. Each camp provides:

- **Free medical consultations**
- **Diagnostic services** (ultrasound, ECG, vision tests, lab work)
- **Pharmacy & emergency care**
- **Maternal health, mental health & counseling services**
- **Health education and prevention sessions**

For many families, this is the first time they receive proper medical attention.

Since **2021**, UCESCO Africa has served **34,256+ patients**, working hand-in-hand with 150+ medical professionals who volunteer their expertise. Through our service learning model, international and local medical students gain hands on experience while supporting doctors and nurses on the ground. This strengthens community resilience and bridges the healthcare gap for thousands of vulnerable families.

The Pamoja kwa Afya Bora initiative aims to:

- **Expand access** to essential healthcare
- **Reduce preventable illness** through early screening
- Provide life-saving treatment at **no cost**
- Support **vulnerable groups**, including mothers, children, and the elderly
- Promote long-term **health knowledge** through education
- Provide structured **referrals** for chronic or advanced cases

These **objectives** allow us to tackle deep health disparities while empowering communities to make informed health decisions.

As we prepare for the **2026** medical camps, our goal is to reach **15,000+** additional patients across urban and remote communities. **By strengthening partnerships, mobilizing volunteers, and improving diagnostic** capacity, we aim to deliver care that is broader, faster, and more impactful. Whether by partnering, volunteering, or offering support, every contribution helps restore dignity, health, and hope ~ pamoja kwa afya bora, together for better health.

BACKGROUND AND IMPACT OF THE UCESCO–AFRICA MEDICAL CAMP PROGRAM

Our medical camps continue to play a vital role in delivering much-needed healthcare to underserved communities by addressing a wide range of conditions. These include **chronic illnesses** such as hypertension, diabetes, and arthritis, as well as acute conditions like infections, skin disorders, and respiratory diseases. The camps also provide **specialized services**, including dental care, eye care, and minor surgical procedures—services that remain inaccessible to many families due to cost or distance.

These interventions have reached the most vulnerable and marginalized regions, such as Kibera, Kariobangi, Kayole, Mathare, and Samburu (Northern Kenya), where limited facilities and economic challenges make healthcare especially **difficult to access**.

The growth of this initiative can be traced back to **2022**, when rising concern over the **lack of affordable and quality healthcare** in Kenya’s most neglected communities led to the establishment of the Pamoja kwa Afya Bora program. What began as a small effort aimed at meeting unmet medical needs in places like Kibera and Mathare communities, where daily life is marked by both struggle and resilience quickly revealed the depth of the healthcare gap.

During that first year, the camp served **3,857 patients**, each encounter highlighting the urgent need for compassionate and affordable medical services. As trust grew and word spread throughout the community, the impact expanded: **5,493 lives** were served in **2023**, and by **2024**, the number rose significantly to **10,906** patients. In June **2025**, the camp reached **13,926** patients, many of whom were in dire need of medical attention.

While these figures are remarkable, they reflect more than statistics. They represent real human experiences; families finding relief after long periods of illness, children receiving care that changes their futures, and entire communities beginning to restore their health. Through these efforts, the program not only treats illness but also **empowers individuals** with the knowledge and support needed to take charge of their well-being, offering hope for a **healthier tomorrow**.



Justine Regan’s Journey

A student at Shining Hope School, Justine suffered from a painful leg deformity. During the 2025 UCESCO–Africa Medical Camp, he received a **life-changing surgery completely free**. Today, he walks with strength and hope, a true symbol of what compassionate care can achieve.

UCESCO–Africa has consistently delivered powerful, high-impact community programs across Kenya and Uganda. Through the Pamoja kwa Afya Bora medical camps, we have treated more than 34,256 patients since 2022, working in informal settlements such as **Kibera, Kariobangi, and Mathare**, as well as rural regions like Samburu. Partnerships with organizations including Citadel, Ministry of Health and numerous local clinics have enabled us to run structured, well-coordinated initiatives that create measurable, life-changing outcomes.

Our focus remains on communities where medical care is unaffordable or inaccessible. Many families cannot afford a single consultation at a hospital, and most lack access to diagnostic services. By bringing treatment, screening, and health education directly to these regions, we close a long-standing healthcare gap and ensure that even the most **vulnerable can access quality care**.

3. Transparency and Accountability

We uphold strong **financial integrity**. Each medical camp is followed by a comprehensive impact report detailing patient numbers, supply tracking, diagnostic outcomes, financial summaries, and photographic evidence. This level of transparency strengthens trust and ensures every contribution is fully accounted for.

4. Long-Term Vision for Sustainable Care

Our work goes beyond one-day treatment. Through the Social Health Authority (SHA), UCESCO–Africa is developing a **long-term model** that ensures continued support for patients diagnosed with chronic conditions such as hypertension, diabetes, and reproductive health complications. We aim to transition from temporary relief to sustained community health.

5. Tangible and Measurable Results

The medical camps offer direct, life-changing impact: **thousands of patients** receive consultations, dental and eye care, maternal support, emergency treatment, health education, and essential medicines. Every contribution is translated into improved health outcomes and restored dignity.

6. Visibility and Recognition for Partners

Organizations that partner with us benefit from **strong brand visibility** across banners, tents, attire, social media platforms, and official reports. This enhances their **corporate social responsibility** profile and reinforces their participation in a national movement for better health access.

7. Comprehensive Service Delivery Under One Roof

UCESCO–Africa’s integrated approach ensures that all key services; triage, consultation, pharmacy, dental care, maternal health, mental health, nutrition support, and emergency response; work in seamless coordination. Partner support allows us to maintain high standards of professionalism, equipment availability, and patient safety.

8. Empowering Future Healthcare Professionals

Our medical camps also serve as a **transformative training** environment for medical students from around the world . They gain hands-on experience through real clinical tasks such as wound care, ultrasound operation, triage, and patient management. Their involvement strengthens both the camp’s capacity and global healthcare development.

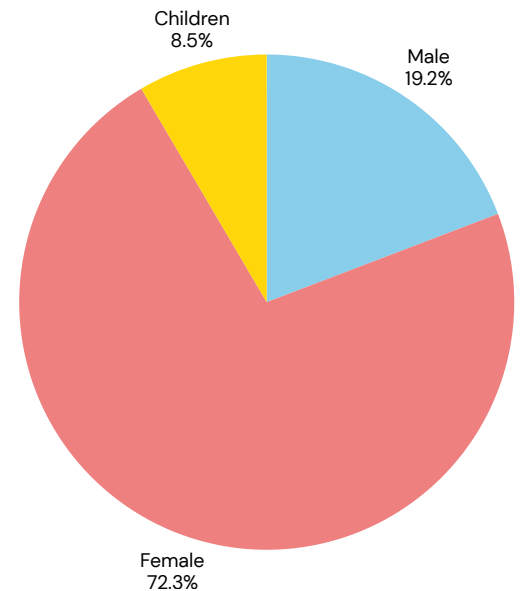

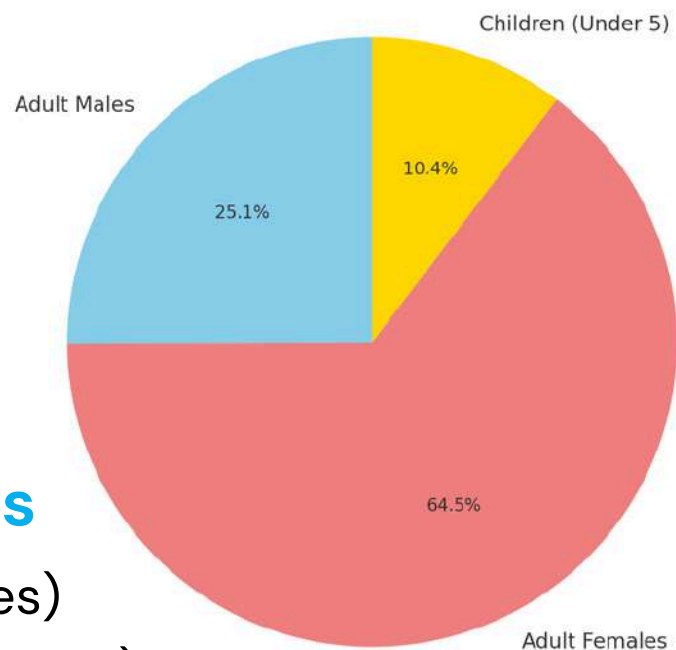
