Project Summary

This project will restore Jamila Bouhayir School in Tal Rifaat, northern Syria, which has been severely damaged by years of conflict. By repairing classrooms, restrooms, and the courtyard, and by providing furniture and learning materials, the school will be able to host full-day education again for more than 1200 children who are currently studying in double shifts due to limited capacity.

The Emergency Context

Tal Rifaat, located in northern Syria within the Aleppo Governorate, was heavily affected by the conflict that began in 2011 and intensified in February 2016 when YPG forces took control of the city. The attack caused the displacement of thousands of residents who fled to refugee camps near Azaz and across the Turkish border.

Continuous clashes and bombardments destroyed homes, schools, health centers, and public infrastructure, cutting children off from safe education for years.

After the liberation of Tal Rifaat in December 2024, about 25,000 people returned to their homes and began rebuilding their lives. However, most schools remain in ruins, forcing children to study in old, damaged caravans that were transported from refugee camps. These makeshift spaces are overcrowded, unsafe, and not suitable for learning. The rehabilitation of Tamadur Secondary School has therefore become a critical priority for restoring access to education and stability in the community.

It includes 19 classrooms and several service rooms, yet most are unusable because of broken walls, damaged ceilings, unsafe electrical wiring, and deteriorated sanitation facilities. Over 1200 students currently attend the school in morning and evening shifts, significantly reducing teaching hours and affecting learning outcomes. The project aims to rehabilitate and fully reopen the school through the following activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Renovation of the main school building and classrooms -Construction and repair of toilets and restrooms -Rehabilitation and fencing of the school courtyard -Provision of new furniture such as desks, chairs, blackboards, and lockers -Supply of educational materials and student stationery <p>The project will use local contractors and materials where possible, supporting community livelihoods and ensuring the sustainability of the intervention.</p>
