During the first half of 2026, Fundación Juanfe consolidated in Cartagena a comprehensive care model that continues to transform the lives of adolescent mothers, migrant women, and their families. Through coordinated interventions in education, mental health, family strengthening, childcare, and employability, we advanced in building opportunities that foster economic autonomy and break cycles of poverty.

Social Return on Investment

The independent impact evaluation, conducted by Universidad de los Andes with the support of the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB), confirmed the effectiveness of our 360° model, showing a Social Return on Investment (SROI) of 11.5%.

This means that for every peso invested, significant social and economic value is generated, sustainably improving the living conditions of young mothers and their families.

Total investment: **\$15,000,000**

Social return generated: **\$23,184,126**

SROI: **11.5% return**

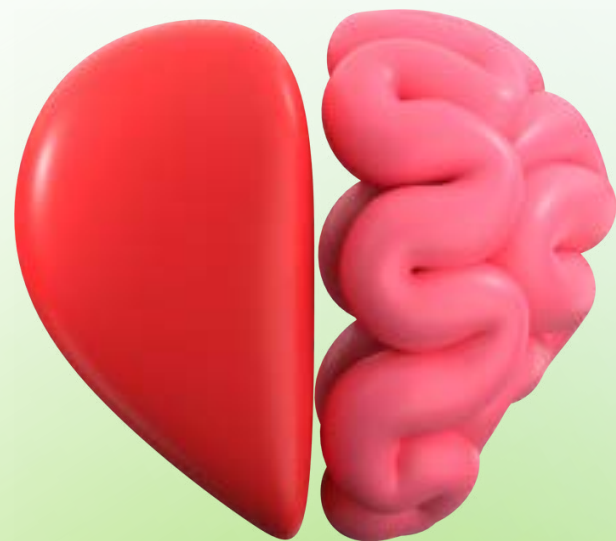

Mental Health: A Path Toward Change

The results achieved during the first half of 2026 reflect significant progress in the emotional well-being of the participants, demonstrating the value of psychosocial support as an enabler of social transformation. Through comprehensive care, Fundación Juanfe strengthens the personal and emotional capacities of adolescent mothers, promoting their continued education, their preparation for employment, and the development of sustainable life projects that positively impact their families and communities.

Achievements

A significant reduction is evident in the risks associated with latent suicidal ideation. Addressing limiting beliefs has enabled the modification of dysfunctional thoughts related to hopelessness and low self-efficacy, fostering processes of emotional regulation and self-care.

Conscious Motherhood and Childcare

During the first period of 2026, Fundación Juanfe strengthened its childcare offering as a key component for the well-being of the participants' children and for keeping women engaged in their educational processes.

Childcare Offering

In Cartagena, the Foundation operates its Comprehensive Child Development Center (CIDI), providing specialized care for the sons and daughters of adolescent and young mothers.

between 6 and 30 months cared for during the year.

50 children

on average per day in comprehensive care.

Impact on Early Childhood and Families

- Strengthening of motor, cognitive, communicative, and socioemotional development.
- Better outcomes in language and motor development, through intentional pedagogical experiences and early stimulation.
- Technical monitoring of child development using the Abbreviated Development Scale (EAD), enabling timely detection and individualized support.
- Strengthening of parenting skills and sensitive caregiving practices, promoting shared family responsibility.
