1. About Village Vision Care (VVC)

Village Vision Care (VVC) is a registered nonprofit organization in Uganda dedicated to empowering vulnerable children, youth, elderly, single and young mothers, and HIV/AIDS-affected families. Our mission is to break cycles of poverty through education, skills development, health support, and community empowerment.

We have a strong track record delivering community programs, including festive support during Christmas, school sponsorships, vocational training, health services, and mentoring programs. Our goal is to foster dignity, self-reliance, and long-term sustainable impact.

2. Project Overview

Project Name: Christmas Hope for Vulnerable Families in Uganda

Goal: \$34,450

Duration: December 2025 – January 2026

Locations: Kasubi–Kasijjagirwa, Masaka City, and surrounding rural communities

Primary Beneficiaries:

- Single mother family in Kasubi (2 boys, 7 and 6, never attended school)
- 267+ vulnerable families in rural communities
- Adolescent girls in communities and correctional centres
- Elderly without family support, struggling single and young mothers, some HIV/AIDS-affected

Purpose: Provide urgent relief and festive support while creating long-term hope, self-reliance, and education opportunities.

3. The Problem

Vulnerable families face severe hardship in Masaka and surrounding areas. An abandoned single mother struggles to feed four children, including two boys who have never attended school. Elderly without family support, struggling single and young mothers, and HIV/AIDS-affected families cannot afford basic necessities or school fees. Many adolescent girls lack access to menstrual products, and youth in correctional centres spend Christmas isolated and forgotten.

4. Solution / Activities

Immediate priority–Kasubi family:

- School enrollment for the two boys (uniforms, books, meals, fees)
- Food, clothing, bedding, shelter support
- Startup capital for a small local restaurant

Broader community support:

- Christmas food packs for 267 households
- Reusable dignity kits and menstrual health education for adolescent girls
- Festive meals and supervised activities for youth in correctional centres
- Health and hygiene support for elderly and HIV/AIDS-affected families

5. Potential Long-Term Impact

- Education for the two boys breaks the cycle of poverty.
- Mother’s restaurant provides sustainable income and independence.
- Food and dignity kits improve nutrition, menstrual health, confidence, and school participation.
- Elderly and HIV/AIDS-affected families receive critical support and dignity.
- Youth in correctional centres gain hope, engagement, and better reintegration opportunities.
- Overall, communities move from crisis to self-reliance, stability, and brighter futures.

Primary: Kasubi–Kasijjagirwa, Masaka City, Uganda

Extended: Surrounding rural communities & youth correctional centres

Description: Activities focus on Kasubi–Kasijjagirwa, Masaka District, while support reaches vulnerable families, adolescent girls, youth in correctional centres, elderly without family support, and HIV/AIDS-affected families in nearby communities.
