Many have **no consistent access** to medical care.

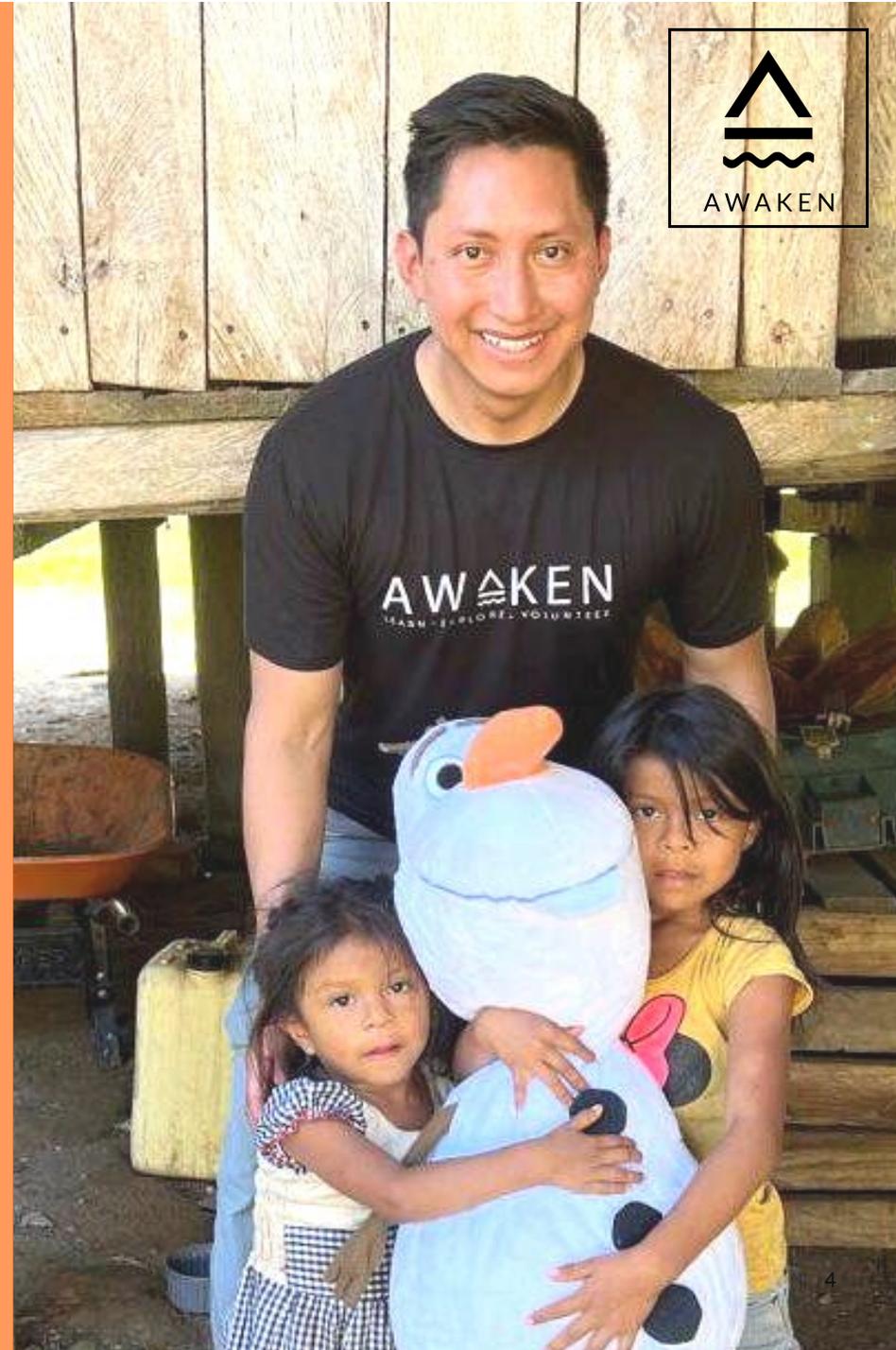

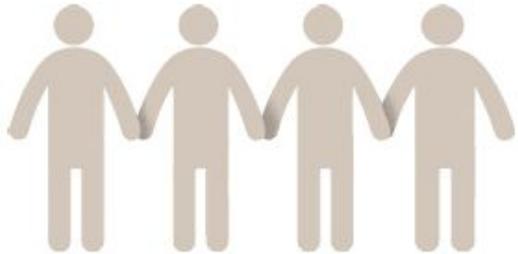

I. The Medical Centre – **Latacunga**



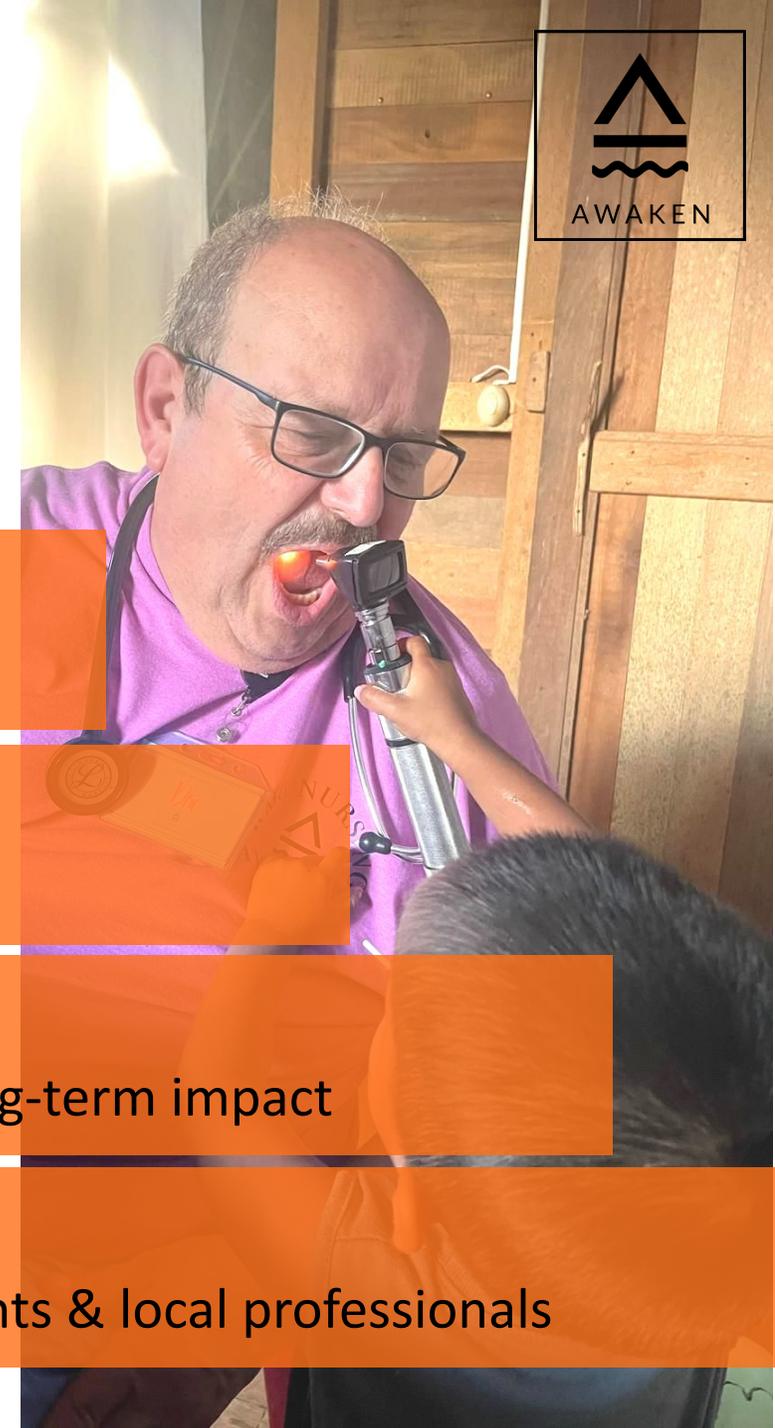
 **Located in Latacunga, Cotopaxi Province**

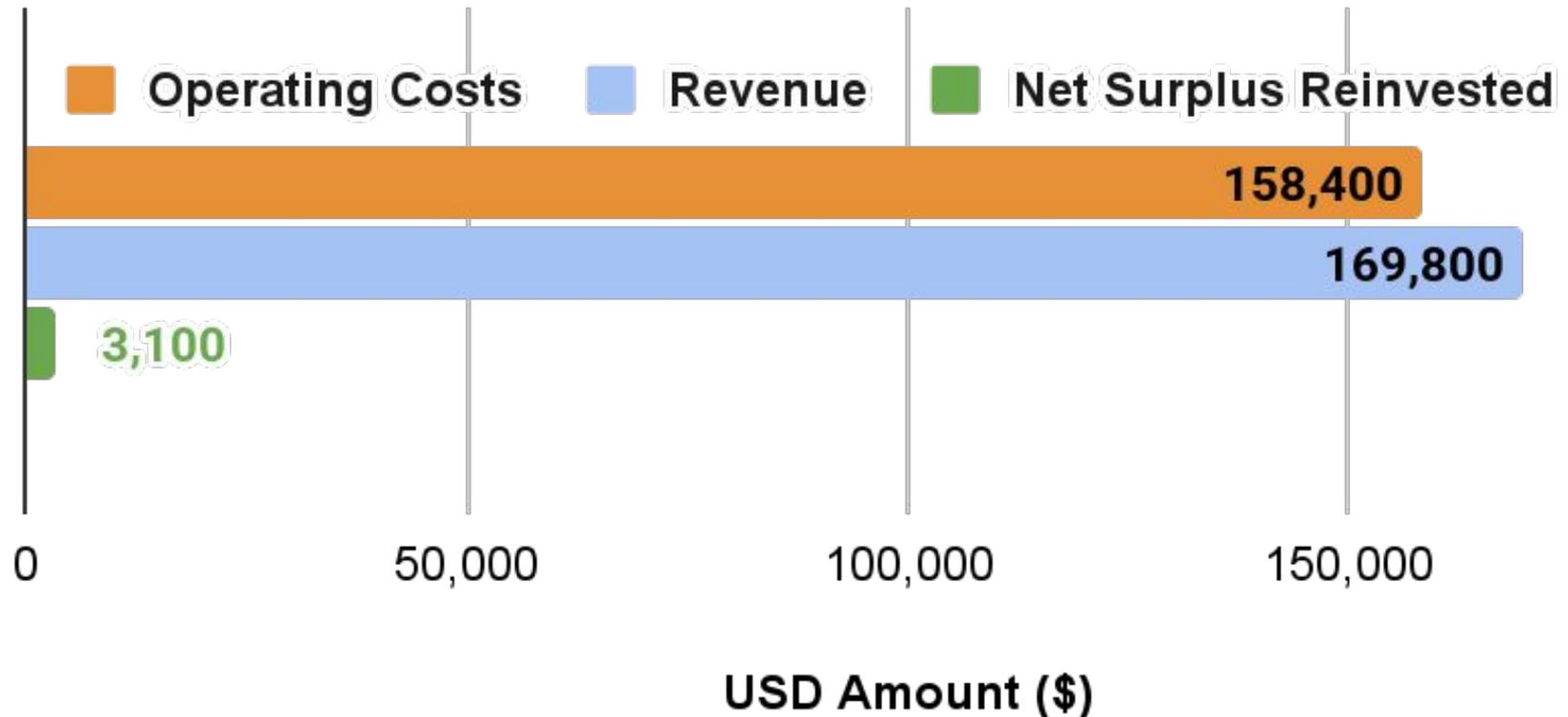
