Project Overview

Cervical cancer is one of the leading causes of preventable deaths among women in Ghana. Many women in peri-urban Tamale lack access to affordable cervical cancer screening and early detection services, leading to late diagnosis and avoidable deaths.

This project aims to screen 500 women for cervical cancer, provide health education, and ensure referral support for women who test positive. Through community outreach, mobile screening clinics, and awareness campaigns, the project will improve early detection and reduce cervical cancer risks among vulnerable women.

Project Objectives

- i. Provide cervical cancer screening services for 500 women in peri-urban Tamale.
- ii. Increase community awareness on cervical cancer prevention and early detection.
- iii. Support referral and follow-up care for women with abnormal screening results.
- iv. Strengthen community-based advocacy for women's health.

Key Activities

- i. Community sensitisation through local leaders, churches, mosques, and radio.
- ii. Mobile cervical cancer screening clinics in peri-urban communities.
- iii. Training Community Health Champions to promote preventive healthcare.
- iv. Referral and follow-up support for women who test positive.
- v. Monitoring, evaluation, and documentation of project results.

Expected Results

- i. 500 women screened for cervical cancer.
- ii. Increased awareness about cervical cancer prevention.
- iii. Early detection and referral for women with abnormal results.
- iv. Improved health outcomes for women and their families.

Estimated Budget
