About *Forsports Foundation*

Forsports Foundation is a Ghanaian registered non-profit organisation, Charity Registration No. D.S.W/6205, established in 2014 and headquartered in Sunyani, Bono Region. For over a decade the Foundation has delivered sport-for-development programming across the Bono, Bono East, and Ahafo Regions, reaching thousands of young people, women, and community members through a fully integrated model that connects sport with education, health and wellbeing, digital skills, and enterprise.

The Foundation operates with a strong governance framework, transparent financial management, and a proven track record of sustained community engagement. Its 2026 to 2030 Strategic Plan sets out an ambitious vision anchored by the Sunyani Integrated Community Sports and Youth Empowerment Centre as the permanent operational hub for all Foundation activities.

The Vision

Sunyani is the capital of the Bono Region and a growing urban centre serving a large and youthful population. The Sunyani Integrated Community Sports and Youth Empowerment Centre is designed to serve as the Foundation's permanent home and a genuine community anchor, a place where young people from Sunyani and the surrounding districts can access sport, learning, health and wellbeing support, digital skills, enterprise development, and international connections under one roof.

The Foundation has operated in this community for twelve years. This Centre is the permanent infrastructure that consolidates and amplifies everything it has built, giving the Foundation the capacity to serve a significantly greater number of people across its full programme portfolio for generations to come.

INFRASTRUCTURE

The Facility

The Centre has been designed to serve both the Foundation's programme delivery needs and the broader community of Sunyani. It is a multi-component facility conceived to function as a genuine community hub, integrating sport, education, enterprise, and health and wellbeing access within a single, professionally managed site.

Astroturf Pitch	Full artificial surface pitch for football and multi-sport use, serving training, competition, and Girls4Goals programming
Community Grass Pitch	Natural grass playing surface for community sport and events
Multi-Court	Hard-surface multi-purpose court for basketball, volleyball, and futsal
Training Hall	Indoor training and fitness facility for athletes and programme participants
Community Hall	Large flexible gathering space for events, community meetings, and programme delivery
ICT Laboratory	Digital skills and technology learning centre for youth participants
Community Library	Reading and study resource centre open to the wider community
Community Workspace	Shared enterprise and co-working space for youth entrepreneurs
Youth Enterprise and Multimedia Suite	Dedicated space for media production, enterprise incubation, and digital content creation
Cafe and Community Hub	Catering and social gathering space serving facility users and the wider community
Changing Rooms and Central Block	Full changing and welfare facilities built to professional standards
Health and Wellbeing Access Point	A dedicated space connecting facility users and community members to health education, wellbeing support, and referral to Sunyani's existing health services
Mini Hostel	Accommodation for visiting student volunteers, international partners, and programme guests

The health and wellbeing access point reflects the Foundation's commitment to holistic community development. Sunyani is well served by existing hospitals and clinics. This space is not designed to replicate or compete with those services but to complement them, providing a trusted first point of contact for health education, wellbeing programming, and onward referral, ensuring that every person who comes through the Centre has access to the support they need.

The mini hostel positions the Centre as an internationally connected facility, enabling visiting student volunteers, partner organisations, and delegations to be hosted on-site and deepening the Foundation's global relationships.

DELIVERY

Timeline and *Deliverables*

A capital commitment of this nature deserves complete clarity on two things: what will be built, and when it will be delivered. This section answers both directly.

What Gets Built

Professional architectural drawings and detailed bills of quantities are currently being prepared by appointed Architects and a Quantity Surveyor. A full visual presentation of the facility, including professional design documentation and renders of every component of the Centre, will be available on completion of this process and can be shared with prospective partners on request. This work is actively underway and represents the project's progression from concept to confirmed professional design.

When It Is Delivered

Full funding is the preferred and optimal route to delivery. A fully funded commitment achieves a complete, operational facility within 24 months, with every component of the Centre delivered and open to the community as a single, integrated project. This is the delivery model the Foundation is actively pursuing and the one that best serves the community from the earliest possible date.

Where full funding is not immediately realisable, phased delivery is available as a structured alternative. The project is designed so that each phase delivers a named, functional component of the Centre that is immediately operational and accessible to the community. Phased delivery extends the overall timeline to up to 48 months, but ensures that no funding commitment sits idle. Every pound committed delivers something visible, named, and in use.

Anticipated Final Cost	A professional development uplift of 10 to 15 per cent is anticipated on delivery of final Architect and QS drawings, consistent with standard capital project progression from concept to detailed design

PARTNERSHIP

Naming Rights and *Partnership Opportunities*

The Sunyani Integrated Community Sports and Youth Empowerment Centre is a permanent, visible, community-anchoring facility in the capital of the Bono Region. Naming rights to the Centre, or to individual components within it, represent a meaningful and lasting legacy opportunity for the right donor or partner.

The facility will serve thousands of people each year and stand as a landmark of community investment in Sunyani for generations. A donor whose name is attached to the Centre, or to a named component within it, is not simply making a financial contribution. They are making a permanent mark on a community and on the lives of the young people the Foundation serves.

All capital partners are given full visibility of project governance, financial management, and delivery progress. The Foundation's governance framework, financial compliance manual, monitoring and evaluation systems, and 2025 Financial Statement are available for due diligence review.

Full Facility Naming Rights	Available to a single lead funder meeting the full capital cost, or the substantial majority of it. The Centre carries the donor's chosen name in perpetuity, reflected in all signage, public-facing materials, and formal documentation.
Component Naming Rights	Available to phase sponsors funding a specific facility component. Options include the ICT Laboratory, Community Hall, Astroturf Pitch, Health and Wellbeing Access Point, Community Library, Youth Enterprise Suite, Mini Hostel <i>etc</i>
Lead Donor Recognition	For significant contributions, formal lead donor recognition in the Centre's governance, public profile, annual reporting, and on-site acknowledgement.
Programme Partnership	Named sponsorship of a specific Foundation programme strand delivered from the Centre, with annual impact reporting to the partner.
In-Kind Partnership	Materials, equipment, professional services, or technical expertise in lieu of or alongside financial contribution, with equivalent recognition.
