Illiteracy, malnutrition, and extreme poverty ravage indigenous communities in the highlands of Guatemala.

- Nearly 77% of the indigenous population is illiterate
- More than 65% of the indigenous children suffer from chronic malnutrition
- Women are 30% more likely to die in childbirth than in the USA
- Nearly 10% of indigenous children die before age 5
