Among them, 10.5 million children aged 5-14 lack access to education, especially affecting girls in northern regions where attendance rates are below 50%. Factors like poverty, gender disparities, conflict, and inadequate education quality pose significant barriers to achieving Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG 4) for inclusive, equitable, and quality education. SDG 4 aims to address the needs of vulnerable populations and recognizes education as crucial for socio-economic progress and sustainable development. Therefore, resolving Nigeria's educational crisis isn't just about access; it's about ensuring quality education for all, fostering inclusivity, and empowering individuals to contribute meaningfully to their communities, ultimately driving sustainable development.
