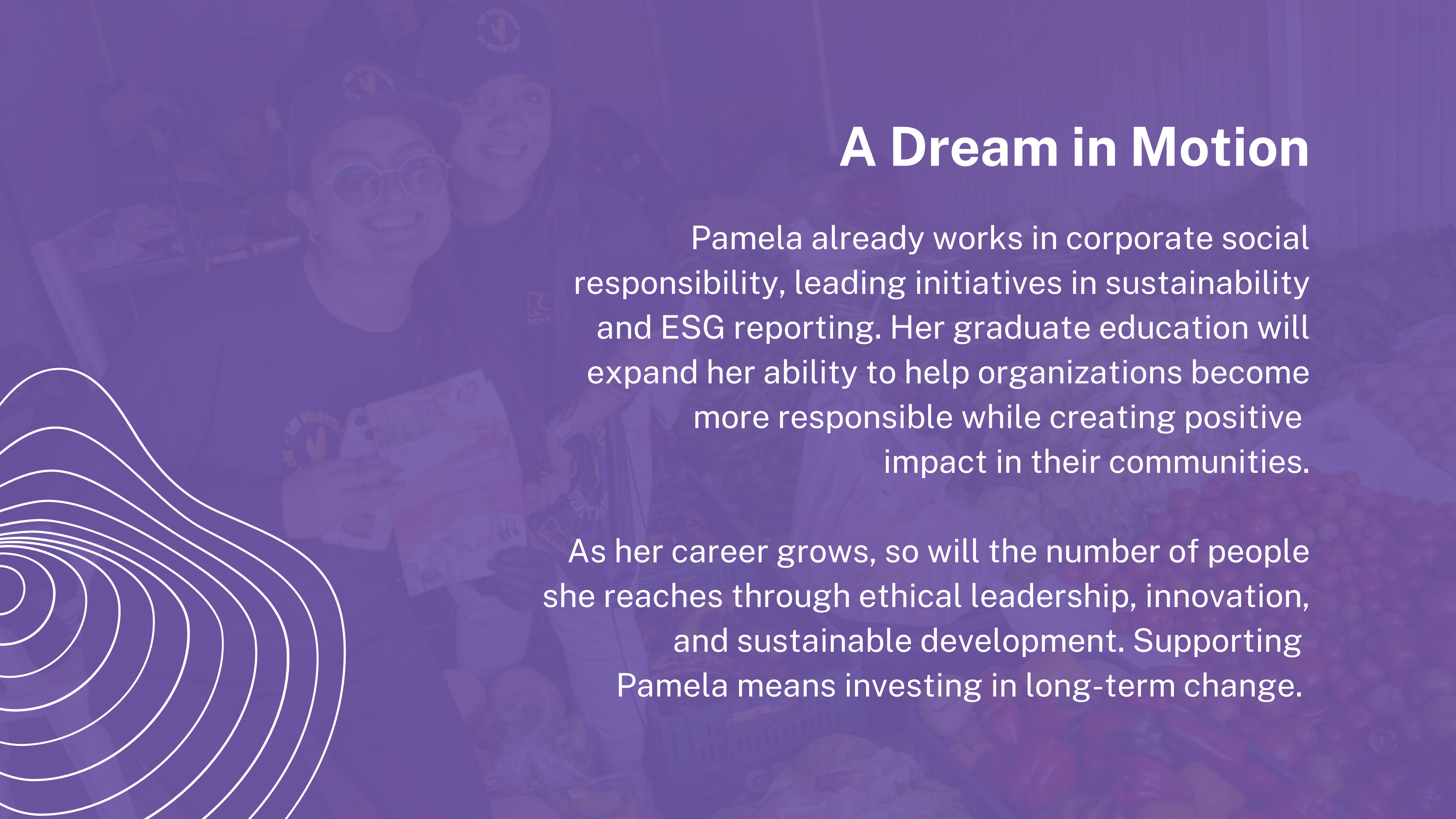


With the support of a scholarship, she is pursuing her dream of graduate education. She is committed to building a more sustainable and equitable society.

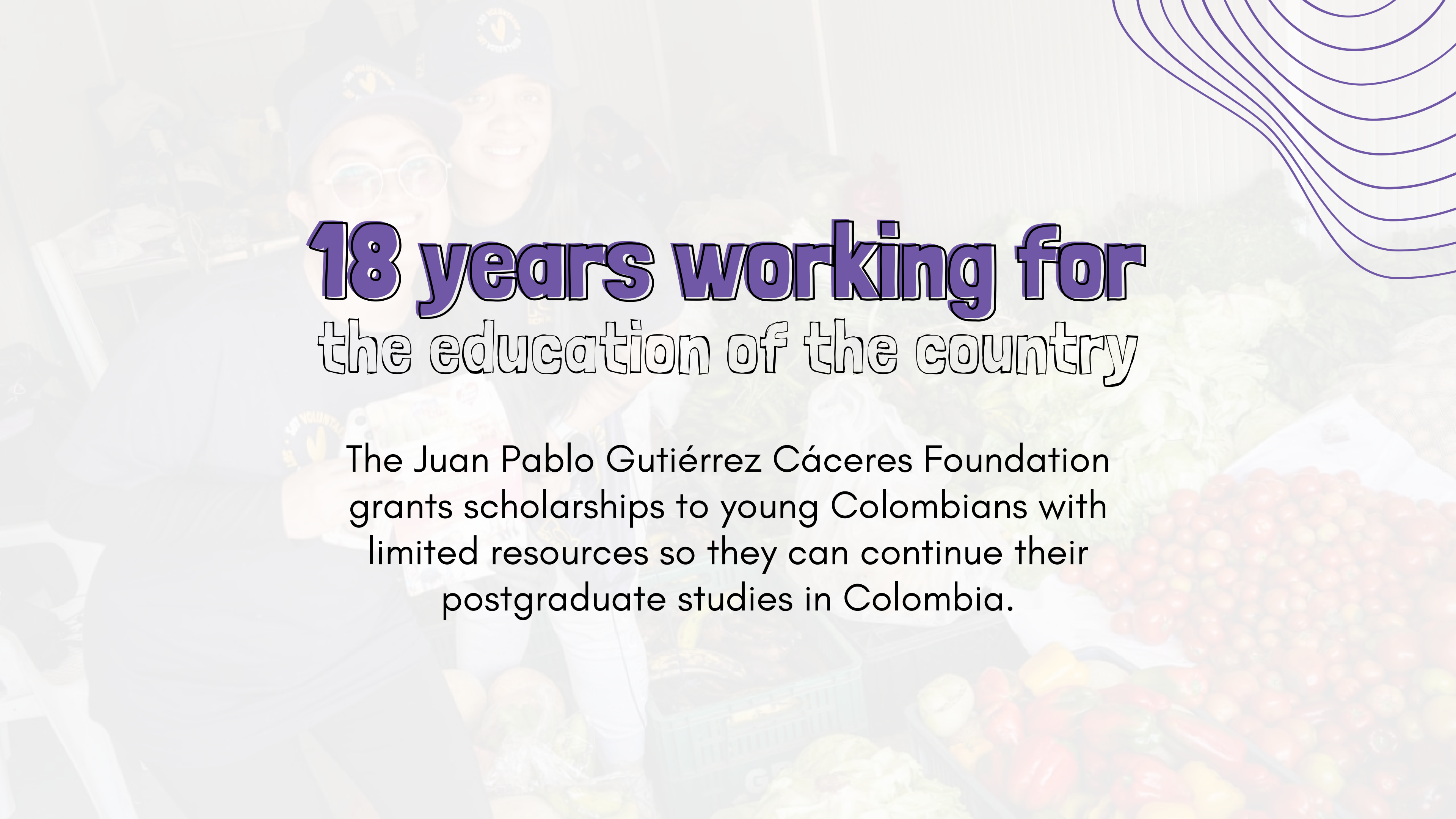
