Arsenic

contamination is the worst chemical calamity in human history. MAAWS is currently tackling this problem with the Pure Drinking Water and Sanitation Project as part of the Health For Villagers @ Program. With private sponsorship, MAAWS is installing arsenic-free tube wells in various villages around Dhaka and Noakhali. Waterborne diseases are easily preventable with simple hygienic practices.

Poor sanitation and drinking water cause medical conditions such as dehydration, diarrhea, cholera and waterborne disease.

Another major issue for drinking water is Arsenic. Arsenic-rich rocks contaminate groundwater through which it filters. Cancer of the skin, lungs, urinary bladder, and kidney, as well as other skin changes such as pigmentation changes and thickening (hyperkeratosis) are effects of long-time exposure of arsenic.

Cemented sanitary toilets are also built to keep a hygienic environment. Many villagers are now able to drink clean water for the first time in their lives. Children are especially susceptible to medical problems caused by arsenic contaminated water. By providing arsenic-free tube wells, they will be able to drink freshwater for life.
