## What is *Mosqoy*?

*Mosqoy* is the Quechua word for “dream.”

We are a charitable organization working to bridge cross-cultural gaps between North America and Peru, founded in 2006. We believe that educating youth is the key to breaking the cycle of poverty and aim to realize the dreams of students in the Sacred Valley of Peru.



## OUR GOALS

**To educate** by providing post-secondary education for 10-20 graduating students per year from the Sacred Valley, in the hopes of establishing a stronger base of professionals among future generations.

**To preserve** by collaborating with the *Q'ente Textile Revitalization Society*, which works with textile communities to strengthen cultural and historical integrity through the Quechua weaving tradition.

**To connect** the elders and youth of the Andes, to connect the cultures and languages of Canada and Peru, and to bridge the gap in the commodity chain between producer and consumer.

## *Mosqoy: Sacred Valley Youth Fund*

The objective of *Mosqoy* is to provide educational opportunities to the children of the Sacred Valley who cannot afford to continue their studies after high school.

Our hope is to create more leaders in the community and establish a chain of reciprocity for families to sustain themselves.

*Mosqoy* assists 10-20 students each year by paying for their studies at a technical institute in Cusco in the career of their dreams (a diploma program of three years). In exchange for this opportunity, students return to their community after graduation to give back through financial support or volunteer work.



## Where do the funds come from?

- Individual sponsors and donors
- The Global Education Program: A project for high school students and university clubs in North America to get involved
- The *Q'ente Textile Revitalization Society*: A quarter of revenue from their textile sales goes to *Mosqoy* students

## *Q'ente Textile Revitalization Society*

Our sister organization, the *Q'ente Textile Revitalization Society* is an incorporated British Columbia not-for-profit society, founded in 2006.

We work directly with weavers of the Sacred Valley region of Peru by providing a fair trade outlet to sell textiles in North America. The project aims to establish sustainability in the region through the textile tradition, which is an integral part of the Quechua culture, history, and economy.
