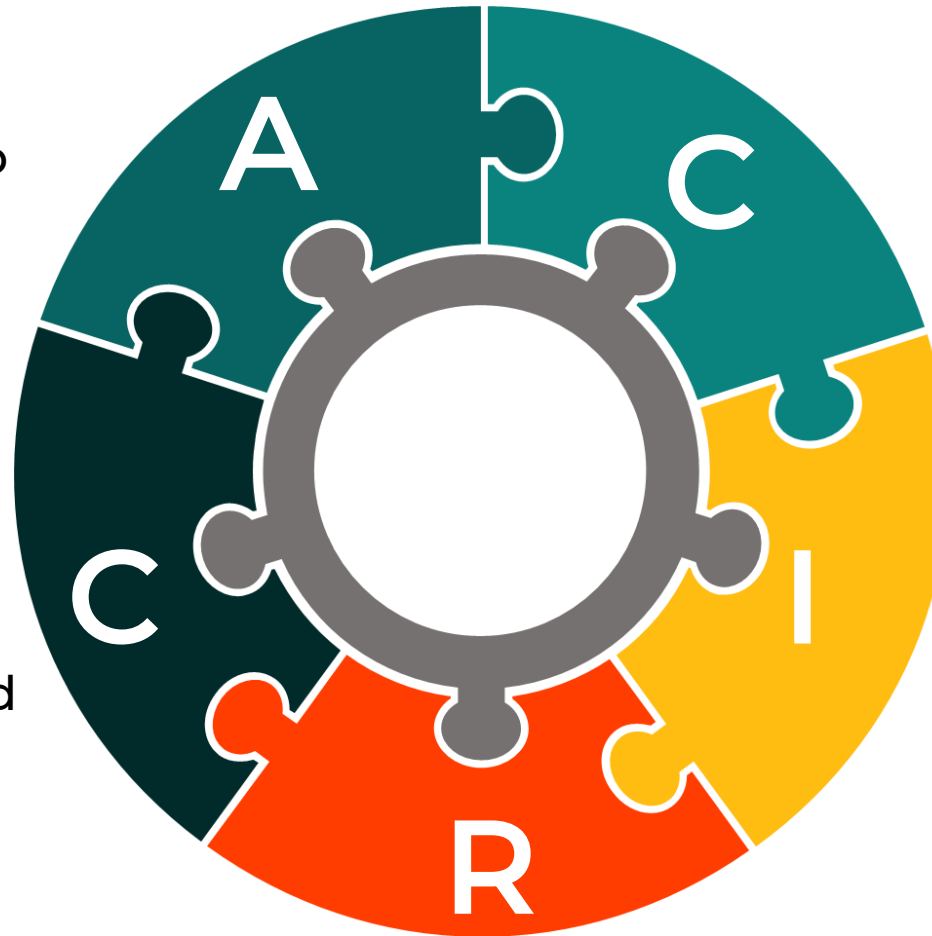

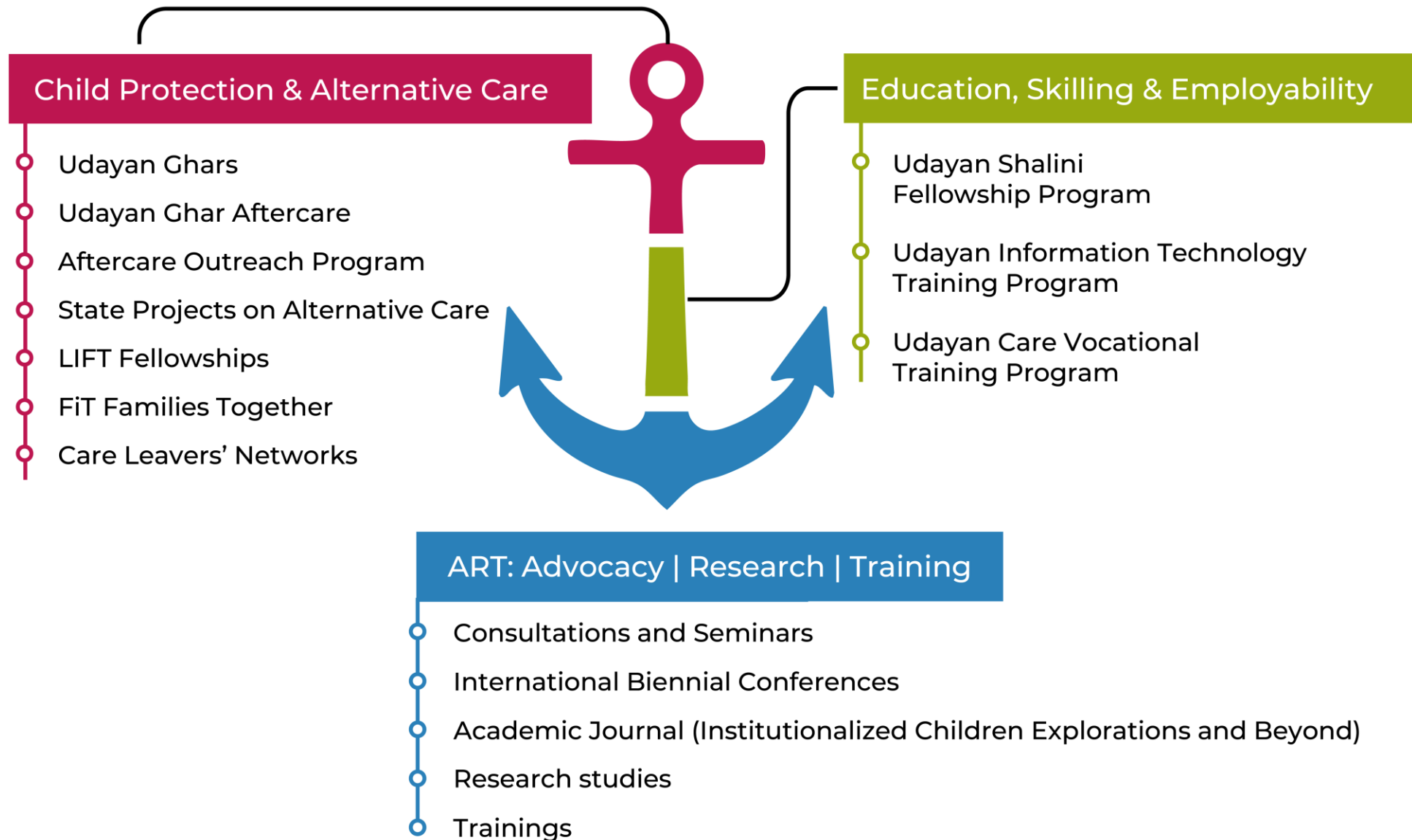

State of the Sector

Report on 2 Day Consultation on Non-Institutional Care
by WCD, CRS and UNICEF in September 2022

According to the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), India has **29.6 million** orphaned and abandoned children. While a safe and secure environment is a prerequisite for any child, there are millions who are less fortunate. The ones born into abject poverty and facing varied deprivations are forced to live in short or long-term residential care in Child Care Institutions (CCIs) by families. Many of these children have families and a 2018 Government of India report also revealed that **most children living in CCIs have a single parent.**





Ruhi (*name changed*)

Reunited with Family

Ruhi was spotted by a kind stranger who felt the child was under duress and informed the police. Many attempts were made to trace her family which yielded no result. The Child Welfare Committee admitted her to Udayan Ghar in Gurgaon in July 2019.

She had a faint memory of her village in Bihar but with no leads emerging despite several tracing attempts, she was declared fit for adoption. During the pre-adoption counselling session, there was a breakthrough when Ruhi was shown a list of villages in Bihar and she was able to recognize the name of her village.

The District Child Protection Unit went to the village in Bihar and finally traced her family of migrant labour to a village near Gurgaon. Ruhi was reunited with her family in August 2020.

Udayan Care reaffirms its faith in the family as being the best place for the child to grow in and is grateful to the State Child Protection Authorities for making it happen.

Pooja: Our Shining Star

Making A Difference through Lived Experiences

Pooja came to Udayan Care at the tender age of 10 years. She was always a bright, confident child who not only expressed her opinions clearly, she also was the role model for many younger children. From early years she was determined to be the voice of the vulnerable.

Pooja chose the development sector and was actively involved in speaking about Alternative Care at various platforms, one of them the Care Leavers Association Network (CLAN).

She was awarded the prestigious Chevening Scholarship to pursue her Master in Development Studies from SOAS, University of London.

She continues to support other careleavers, some of them from Udayan Care with their SOPs, essays, CV and recommendation letters.

Our Model: Living In Family Environment (LIFE)

Children without parental care, orphaned, abandoned, neglected sometimes by their biological families and children with special needs deserve extra care and protection



SMALL GROUP HOMES

Care and Protection to small groups (12 children) of the same gender in residential neighbourhoods. Some units are double units with a strength of 24 children



ALL ROUND CARE & DEVELOPMENT

Focus on the wholesome development of children through education, mental health support, and mentoring



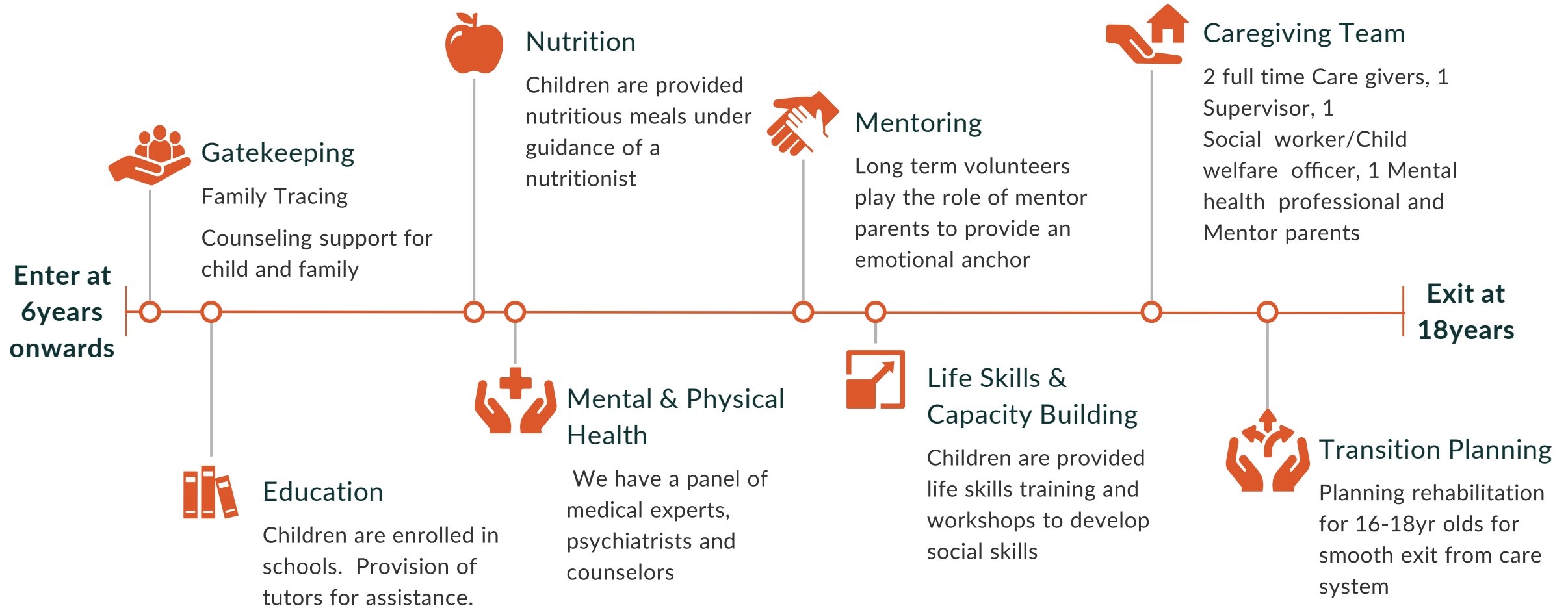
VOLUNTEERS AS MENTOR PARENTS

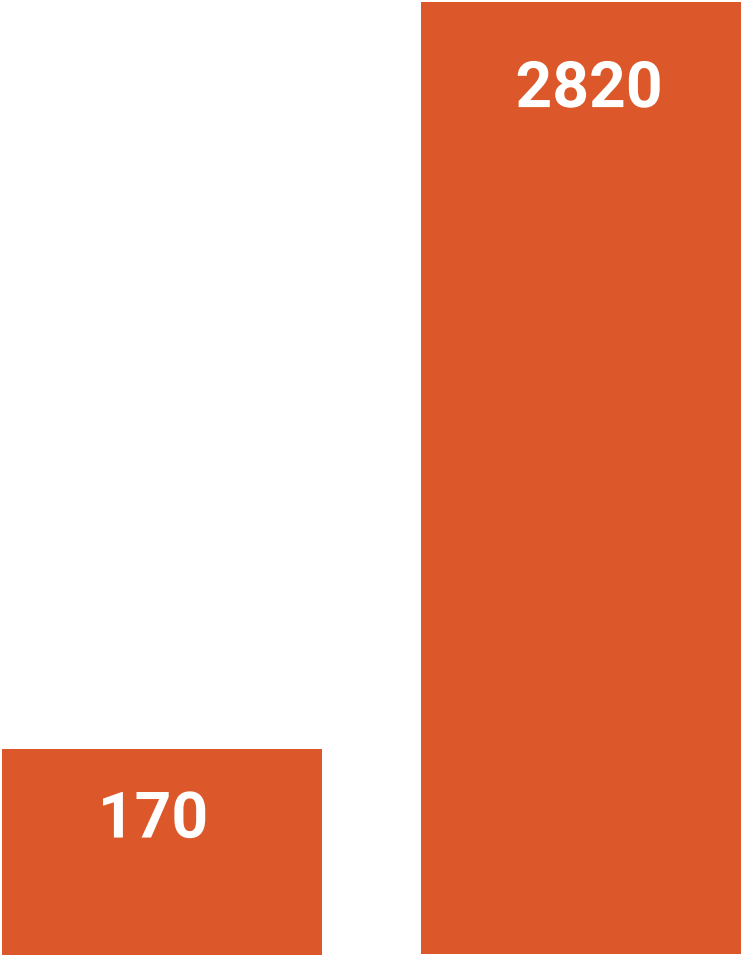

Anjali's Story

22 Yrs

Anjali lost her mother when she was just 3 years old and was admitted to a childcare home housing 100 children. She was lost in the crowd. The trauma of her past and rejection by her family resulted in Anjali becoming an anxious child, low on confidence, and with a poor educational foundation.

Life took a turn and she was admitted to Udayan Ghar at 10 years of age. The Ghar Team put their sincere efforts to nurture little Anjali, and with consistent warmth, support, guidance and love of the mentor mother, care givers, and social workers, she blossomed into a cheerful, helpful, compassionate, and hardworking young person.

He showed a passion for sports especially football during his school days. He secured 78% in his XII and decided to follow his passion and become a professional football player. He secured admission to Lovely Professional University as a scholarship student.

Raja has had a 14 years long successful stint with football. He has represented his University, his State and has also been selected for international camps at Poland and Siberia. He recently participated in the All India Open Football Tournament as the main striker with the Delhi Team.

Narmdi was also selected for the Fellowship program for Care Leavers. She is committed to improving the situation of care leavers like herself

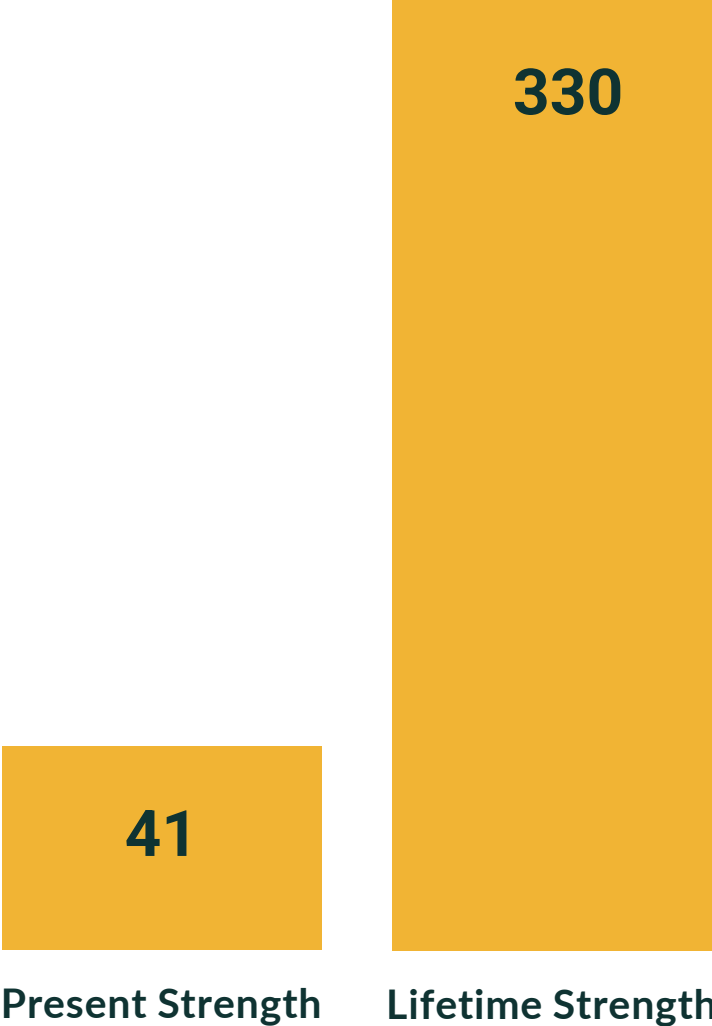
