Organization Key responsibilities

- WEWASAFO offices are currently used as secretariat for Western province NGOs Network and the CEO is the Coordinator and the Executive Committee Member of The National Council of NGOs - Kenya
- The same offices are also used as a secretariat for Kakamega Urban Development Forum, a local urban forum structuring up to undertake Kakamega urban development in line with CSUDP initiative in partnership with Ecotact and The Swedish Embassy.

 The mission is working together with the less privileged and marginalized members of the communities in Western Kenya to reduce poverty through harnessing and utilization of local resources for sustainable development.

- 4. HIV/AIDS awareness,


Achievements (So Far)

The organization has undertaken the following development activities;

1. Water, Sanitation and Hygiene(WASH) Programme

- Construction of water intake facilities-50m³ tanks, pumphouses, intake Springs
- Water kiosks Hand dug wells VIP and ecosan latrines
- Training of the community working group on management and financial management, monitoring and procurement
- Training on sanitation and hygiene promotion
- Advocate for the rights of children and women in communities

Achievements (So Far) cont

2. Gender and Democratic Governance

- WEWASAFO has conducted civic education to citizens on gender and democratic governance issues empowering them to engage the duty bearers in line with the provisions in the new constitution.
- We have built capacities of women, children and youth to claim their rights and be able to participate effectively in development issues at the grassroots level.
- Currently we are involved in the implementation of Amkeni waKenya's fourth call for proposals on implementation of the new Constitution in Kakamega County
- We are conducting bill of rights forums (in relation to water, sanitation and hygiene) for engagement with the duty bearers and the claimholders (for citizenry advocacy to policies and priorities of water, sanitation and hygiene among others)

Achievements (So Far) cont

3. Agriculture and Food Security

Currently we are implementing Kenya Agricultural Productivity and Agribusiness Project - KAPAP project in Kakamega County.

The project is funded by World Bank in partnership with the Government of Kenya through Min. of Agriculture coordinated at the Regional Service Unit –RSU Kakamega.

We are majoring in provision of agricultural extension services in Local poultry production, value addition and marketing.

Achievements (So Far) cont

4. HIV/AIDS

- The organization has reached out to people on HIV/AIDS awareness and there is a positive impact on behavior change.
- We are providing education, social and economic support to 20 orphans and vulnerable children – OVCs in Lurambi Constituency.
- In the Kakamega County, we are in partnership with Constituency AIDS Control Committee – CACC Lurambi and networking with EDDO NGO on disability issues.

HIV/AIDS current activities

i. Prevention

The department is currently working towards preventing new infection through HIV Education, Peer Education, prevention and Risk Reduction activities.

In addition, we offer condom education and promotion among the members in the community. We also carry out workshops targeting the single youth and youth couples, with an aim of capacity building them on Facts on HIV/AIDS.

The same is done during peer education. In the process, we take the participants through demonstration of condom use. Every location has its workshop on the same package above.

The department does follow up on the workshop through action plans developed during the training.

ii. Care

Care for people living with HIV (PLHIV) aspect is achieved through providing training for Care givers and community Health workers (CHWs). The department trains participants on Home based care. We do follow up on the workshop through action plans developed during the training.

iii. Support

Mitigation of social economic impact of HIV is done through OVC educational support and encouraging PLHIV support group activities.

The department with the help of local administration identify OVCs who are supported with school uniforms, supplementary secondary school fees and others supported with Vocational skills training tuition fees for those who have dropped out of school (Class 8 finalists).

The department is proposing training Centre for skills training. PLHIV support group activities include skills training on HBC and Income Generating Activities (IGA).

We have establish groups whom we will carry out follow up of PLHIV activities on quarterly basis.
