Our academic year 2013-14 ended in March 2014 and it was a busy couple of months at all our Learning Centres. Our volunteers worked tirelessly conducting extra classes, revision tests and assessments to help their students do well in the year-end examinations.

ENGLISH CENTRES

The Kites Series from Macmillan is used in all our English Learning Centres. It has an interactive, activity-based curriculum that has been designed with respect to the guidelines in the National Curriculum Framework. The Final Examination for each level in this course was held in March and the average scores of the students in each level of the different English Centres are given below:



1. Ashwini Trust Learning Centre

We work with Ashwini Charitable Trust to teach the students of Standards 2nd to 7th. These children come from under-privileged communities and are schooled in the nearby Government schools.

CREATIVE SKILLS AND COUNSELLING CENTRE The Women's Home

Creative Skill Classes

This State-run Home is a safe home for women rescued from **domestic abuse**, **trafficking and prostitution**. U&I Volunteers work with them to help them support themselves financially by teaching these women different skills with the help of professionals in the specific craft. They also receive a 'Vocational Training Certificate' that will be beneficial once they leave the Home. Classes were temporarily suspended for a month due to a change in the State Officials overseeing the Home and we resumed classes again in March for 2 weeks before ending the year with a party for the women and the volunteers.

Here is an overview of all the different skills taught to the women through the past year:

- Block printing and screen painting
- Lantern making
- Icing of cupcakes
- Bottle decoration
- Making of paper bags
- Origami
- Nail art
- Making of paper mats

• Zentangle – This is a technique of pencil art that improves concentration and enhances creative skill.
