




The Teacher Foundation's Vision

improving teachers is the key!






Why support teacher development?

Schools in Rural Karnataka

Rural Karnataka, India....one of the educationally most backward areas of the country!

In 2011, in Yadgiri district - just **46%** of children passed the 10th Grade exam! - mere **29%** passed the 12th Grade exam!





Schools in Rural Karnataka

Teachers are unable to use engaging strategies with children of all kinds of abilities





The Teacher Foundation in North Karnataka

Trained more than 1,000 teachers so far in various programs
