- Campaign to Clean the Beaches in Uvira and in Baraka in collaboration.

Socio-Economic Area

- Psychosocial rehabilitation of victims of war-related violence, in close cooperation with 10 community base groups.
- Development of value chains in agriculture through the project "from field to market" to facilitate market access.
- Project study for setting up agro-pastoral co-operatives.
